Introduction

The Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Patiala has been established by the State Legislature Act No.19 of 2019 as the first Open University in the State of Punjab. The mission and vision of the University is to provide quality education to all who intend to pursue higher education. The University will provide flexible Open Learning Opportunities through new and emerging forms of technology to achieve global quality education. The University is empowered to award degrees as specified under section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956 at its departments and to students studying in its Learner Support Centres (LSCs) with the approval of its statutory bodies/councils, wherever required. The University is governed by four statutory bodies: The Board of Governors, Planning Board, Academic Council and the Finance Committee.

Open and Distance Learning

Open and Distance Learning is the fastest growing field of education because of the development of IT tools. The concept of an open learning system has become popular because it does away with many hassles that come in the way of the traditional educational system as it is beyond place, pace, duration and it has the potential to provide avenues of lifelong learning. Modular Approach to Programmes

The programmes offered by the University incorporate the spirit of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 following a flexible arrangement of teaching and learning. Keeping this objective in mind, the University follows a modular approach to programme development. This approach provides flexibility in the combination of courses as well as methods to facilitate the learner. Under this approach, each course is allocated a certain credit weightage. A learner enrolled in a modular programme can exit the programme at a designated point and can obtain a certificate or diploma, depending on the number of credits completed. Modularity is also implemented by providing options for multiple entries to the degree programmes. This approach helps students to meet professional requirements and also provides space for upgrading their knowledge/skills as per their requirements and convenience.

Credit System

(i) Defining Credit in ODL: The University follows the 'Credit System' for all of its programmes. A learner has to spend 15 hours on various learning activities to earn 01 credit. Completion of an academic programme (Degree or Diploma) requires successful completion of the

assignments, practicals, projects and term-end examinations as per the requirements of each course in a programme.

(ii) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): The Bachelor's Degree Programmes offered by the University follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by UGC. The CBCS is a flexibility system to study at one's own pace along with greater choice of interdisciplinary, intradisciplinary and skill-based courses. The CBCS model helps integrate education with global standards.

Programme Delivery

The methodology of programme delivery followed by an Open University is distinct from that of conventional universities. Open University follows a learner-centric model where the learner is an active participant in the pedagogical (teaching and learning) process. The mode of delivery of instruction is in the form of e-contents available online through, the university LMS portal. All the courses of the University are developed following the 4-quadrant instructional model consisting of videos, texts, and self-assessment.

Quadrant I: It contains video and audio lectures prepared by the faculty of the University in an organized form which is available to the learners on the University portal.

Quadrant II: It contains the self-instructional material for both theory and practical components of the programme and is made available to the learners in the form of e-texts for every course.

Quadrant III: It contains web resources known as open Educational Resources.

Quadrant IV: It contains the self-assessment component which includes Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), quizzes, assignments and solutions and a discussion forum for clarifications on general misconceptions.

Integrating 21st Century Skills through 'Open and Distance learning' @ PSOU

The rapid pace of technology has led to numerous changes in society and the labour market. Society has witnessed a shift from a static industrial society to a dynamic knowledge society. Even jobs have changed from routine production to one which requires more flexibility and problem-solving abilities. With these changes, the globe is witnessing the birth of an innovative economy. In this changing environment to participate effectively, students need to think critically, communicate effectively, collaborate with diverse peers, solve complex problems, adopt a global mind-set, and engage with information and communication technologies. The experts have recognised three categories of new age skills: Learning Skills, Literacy Skills and Life Skills. These are also known as 21st Century skills. Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University offers a basket of degree, diploma and certificateprogrammes that comprehensively develop these skills among the learners.

School of Sciences and Emerging Technologies

About the School

In this age of Technological advancement, where everything is being digitalised, knowledge about computer is essential. The School of Sciences and Emerging Technologies of Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Patiala, has started Master, Bachelor and Certificate/Diploma Programmes in emerging technologies. The university has adopted a choice-based credit system, which has been introduced by the University Grant Commission (UGC). All the Programmes offered by the school are broad-based programmes covering disciplinary, interdisciplinary and skill-based subjects. It provides flexibility for the learners to choose the subjects of their interest and allows them to grow with the present digital era. Undergraduate programs are a mix of Core Courses, Discipline Specific Electives, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses. Apart from these, the programmes include three non-credit yet compulsory qualifying courses: Teachings of Sikh Gurus, Human Rights, Drug Abuse: Problem, Prevention and management. 





















Examination Branch

The Examination Branch at Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University is focused on the reliable evaluation of the teaching and learning processes and ensures the transparency in the examination system with well-qualified & dedicated exam branch staff through the usage of quality assessment examination tools. The web page of examination branch (https://psou.ac.in/examination) showcases the updated information related to examination regarding display of exam notices, downloads, exam datesheet and Result section. The online examination system portal provides real-time information regarding examination for students, faculty, exam centres & various Learning Support Centres (LSCs) of the University. Online exam portal facilitates students and exam centres regarding issuing of online admit card to students, student verification, uploading of student marks and attendance, exam performas and online bill generation regarding conduct and evaluation related to exams.

The Examination Branch conducts offline exams at various exam centres in colleges of Punjab. Offline exams for Sikhya Daat scheme (Jail Centres) students & Differently abled students are also being conducted by JGND PSOU. Exams for certificate and diploma Programmes are being conducted on OMR sheets (having MCQs questions) while Degree Programme (PG & UG) are being conducted on written Theory answer books. Webinars are also conducted by the examination branch for generating awareness about online examination portal & regarding the resolving of various exam issues and instructions which are provided to colleges for conduct and evaluation of exams. Information is also being disseminated to all the Learner Support Centres estaiblished of various colleges of the University through whatsapp groups, E-mail and helpdesk of the examination branch so as to streamline the process of examination. Examination Branch declares results for the students through result notifications and provide same online on university website. Examination Branch also coordinates for evaluation of answer books of exams & also issues DMCs to students who have got passed in various certificate/diploma/degree Programme in each admission cycle. RAGGING: Prohibition, Prevention and Punishment

The University Grants Commission vide its letter no F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated 17th June, 2009, has reiterated the ban on ragging of students in institutions of Higher Learning. - Check the eligibility conditions of the programmes for which you are seeking admission.
- Fill in all the information asked in the online form carefully. In case of any doubt or query, either read the Prospectus or call at 94630-82523 (9:00 am to 5:00 pm) or contact helpdesk at admissioncell@psou.ac.in
- While filling up the form, please be sure of the spellings of your name, the name of your father, and mother.
- You are advised to provide the correct postal address/correspondence address as well as your mobile phone number and E-mail id.
- While filling up the online Admission cum Examination form, candidate should indicate preferences for cities of Examination Centre of his/her choice as mentioned in the prospectus/website. The University reserves the right to abolish any city for Examination Centre.
- Fee can be deposited "ONLINE" through Net Banking/Credit Cards/Debit Cards. The Students are advised to keep the photocopy of the University Fee Receipt.
- Fee once paid at the time of admission to any programmes shall not be refunded (except refundable securities):

- If a candidate is not enrolled because he/she has not submitted the required certificate/documents by the last date fixed for the purpose or submitted bogus or forged documents, his/her fee shall not be refunded in any case.
- If a candidate drops out in the middle of the programme, the fee paid by him/her, shall not be refunded.

• Refund of Fee (specific provision)

- ➤ If a candidate is found ineligible by the University, then the fee paid by him/her shall be refunded after a deduction of 25% of the fee paid by him/her.
- Whenever a refund is permissible, the candidate must apply for refund to the Registrar, JGNDPSOU within three months of the date of issue of the letter of ineligibility by JGNDPSOU failing which the request for refund will not be entertained.

Verification of the Original Certificates/Documents

Admission will be provisional till the verification of the original certificates/documents and their subsequent confirmation by the University. The students are required to bring the original certificates/documents as and when the University demands. These will be returned to the students after verification. The University reserves the right to cancel the provisional admission and/or the result of any part of the examination of the concerned programmes of any student whose certificates/documents are found to be bogus, forged and tampered with.

In such cases, the fee deposited shall not be refunded.

Thus, it is the responsibility of the student to submit the required authentic certificates and documents within the stipulated period as and when demanded, failing which his/her admission shall stand cancelled without any notice.

Change in Subject/Medium of Instruction

While requesting for change of subjects one may keep in mind the permitted combination of subjects mentioned in the Prospectus.

- I. A student may be permitted to change his/her subject/medium of instruction within one month of the commencement of the session or within one month of the date of admission whichever is later without paying any fee. For JGNDPSOU students, the session may be deemed to have commenced with effect from the last date on which the study material is mailed or made available on LMS Portal to the student by JGNDPSOU.
- II. The student can change his/her optional subject or medium of instruction or programme without any extra fee within one month of his/her admission. However, after one month, the change will only be done by paying a requisite late fee within a time framework of fifteen (15) days.
